Moderator's Message

Greetings PW Sisters.

Where did summer go? Before you jump into fall programming, if you haven't already done so, please take time to reflect on your vacation or stay-cation. Dedicate time to relax, refresh your spirit, appreciate God's amazing creation, and listen quietly to hear what God has to say to you.

It's been a year since Presbyterian Women's Churchwide Gathering with the theme, "Arise! Shine! Your light has come! I want to thank and acknowledge the women in our presbytery. Rising up, through our activism in numerous peace and justice initiatives, we shined our lights both locally and globally. But more than that, we celebrated the Light that Has Come. We took time to develop deeper and more meaningful relationships with God.

Continuing our commitment to shine, we will be aligned with the General Assembly's call for Presbyterians to become Matthew 25 churches. What is a Matthew 25 church? Based on the Matthew 25:31-46 passage, the PC(USA) encourages us to boldly and compassionately serve people who are hungry, oppressed, imprisoned or poor. You can read more about this initiative on the PC(USA) Mission website.

I'd like to call your attention the fact that Sept 1 - Oct 6, 2019 is the Season of Peace. The Mission Agency's Peacemaking website has resources, including daily devotions that can help us focus on our call as peacemakers. If you have the time and energy I'd like to encourage individual PW circles/ organizations to plan a Tea for Peace Day. It's real simple. Pick a day within the Season of Peace. On that day, either as a group or individually, sip a cup of Fair Trade tea and pray for peace. The PW website (type **Tea for Peace** in the Search box) has peace scriptures and quotes that can be used.

Don't forget that you can help your church prepare for any kind of a disaster. Apply yourself or encourage a woman in your congregation to complete the paperwork to become a PW Disaster Preparation Trainer. Remember, we need 20 women to apply for a trainer to come conduct a training in the Bay Area. For more information and the application go to the Presbyterian Women's website and type "pw pda" or "Disaster Preparedness" in the Search box.

SOJOURNER TRUTH PRESBYTERIAN WOMEN HOSTS “LOVE NEVER FAILS” LATE EVENING OUTREACH

On Saturday, July 13, 2019, STPC Presbyterian Women hosted our very first Late Evening Community Outreach with Love Never Fails Human Trafficking Organization.

Love Never Fails Human Trafficking Organization (LNF) was founded in 2011 by Vanessa Russell (pictured above). In 2010, one of her teenage dance students experienced human trafficking in the SF Bay Area. Although she was eventually located and is now being restored, Vanessa encountered many others who, like her student, were U.S. born women, men and children trapped in modern day slavery. Her response was to launch Love Never Fails, a non-profit dedicated to the restoration, education and protection of those involved or at risk of becoming involved in domestic human trafficking.

Love Never Fails has educated thousands of children and community members on the issue of human trafficking, opened a home that provides long-term safe housing and restorative services for over 100 women survivors and their children. They also have a Community Pantry to help the survivors with daily needs. Vanessa believes that the issue of human trafficking can be solved through love expressed in prayer, safe housing, mentoring, job training, outreach, and education. STPC Presbyterian Women’s Mission of eradication, education and prevention of human trafficking coincides with the Mission of Love Never Fails.

LNF outreaches monthly to cities across the Bay Area to vulnerable individuals including the exploited and the homeless. During the outreach LNF offers toiletries, snacks, water, wristbands that say, "You Are Loved", resources, prayer and encouragement to the vulnerable and broken. STPC PW were able to participate with them.

That Saturday night of July 13th, the women of STPC, came through and donated an abundance of supplies, along with the Food Pantry! We had so many donations that we were able to provide the surplus to Love Never Fails for their Community Pantry. Everyone donated socks, slippers, snacks, food, water, grooming aids, toiletries, toilet paper, and the Food Pantry donated bread, cookies, and grapes. Special thanks to Sandra Tramiel, Kendra Tramiel, Beverly Smith-Miller, Jan Rodgers, Ms. Cora Brown, Bea Jett, Melva Spigner, Eposi Ngomba-Tokeson, Connie Bridgewater, my cousin Sheila Williams, and the Food Pantry, for the donated supplies.

Sable Horton of LNF, came with a big smile on her face, to greet us and go over the instructions for outreach. Sable had an even bigger smile when she saw the many donations! Sable is a survivor of human trafficking, who started as a volunteer at LNF and is now the Administrative Assistant and Survivor Leader. Sable is also a praise dancer and dances with the LNF Praise Team. Then Vanessa Russell, Founder of Love Never Fails, came in with an even broader smile than Sable!

After sorting and bagging the items for distribution, Connie, Melva, Eposi, myself, and LNF, prayed together for the safety and protection of the ministers and the ones being ministered to. Vanessa and Sable went out to minister, while the rest of us stayed at the church and prayed. We prayed every hour on the half hour. We prayed with LNF before they left on the outreach, we prayed for LNF and God's beloved during the outreach, and we prayed with LNF when they returned.

Vanessa and Sable walked from 23rd and MacDonald to the BART station, ministering to 19 men and 26 women!!!! They said the people were grateful and thankful especially for the snacks! Although the Presbyterian Women did not go out and walk amongst God's children, it was such a blessing and experience to be able to participate in the Mission of God!

So, some of our women made scarves for the bears that Good News Bears donated for us to give to the Vision Project. Connie Clark wrote the following message which was attached to each bear:

So, during the time these young women were learning about opportunities in their new country, they were given a bear to help them remember the time spent together. It is good that we can have partnerships in our communities to send out and share with others. Presbyterian Women can often

"think outside the box" and for that we can be grateful.

Old First in San Francisco gives us an opportunity to take part in the Vision Project of the International Rescue Committee in Northern California (www.rescue.org/Oakland) as it empowers immigrant girls in Oakland schools by giving them the skills and support they need to envision their futures as women in America. Old First Presbyterian Church is matching other churches' gifts to the IRC designated for the Project. Churches that participate can double the impact of their gifts. Old First will match gifts dollar-for-dollar up to \$500 per congregation and an overall total of \$5,000. This matching opportunity will be open until November 1st.

Catherine Coleman, my husband and I had the privilege of attending a reception for these young women at the end of their project this summer (pictured below). Such an absolute joy to be in this group of energy from young women, donors and volunteers. Any questions, ask us!
