**Class Description:** How is the Old Testament relevant to your faith today and in our larger society? Is the OT a unified story that leads to Jesus? This class is intended to be a high-level introduction to the Old Testament, exploring these questions and more. We will look at the basic structure (comparing differences between the Protestant, Jewish, and Catholic canons), the types of literature that make up the books, talk about the language, history, and theology. We will also talk about the uses that the church has historically made of the books as well as how churches generally use the Old Testament today.

7. Do you believe the Bible to be true, and, if so, in what ways?

Think about how the Old Testament in particular has shaped your understanding of the Bible.

#### Post-course Assignment

Take about two pages to reflect on what the Old Testament is about. In particular, write about how the Old Testament is relevant to your faith today, and in our larger society. Pick some of the topics we discussed and show the relevance. Or, using what we discussed, show how the Old Testament "is a unified story that leads to Jesus."
