#### WHO CAN PARTICPATE?

## **High School Teenagers -**

### **HOW MUCH DOES 2022 PYT COST?**

**\$1,725 (Split 3-ways)** – This cost includes: registration fee, airfare, room & board, ground transportation, group T-shirt, etc. (possibility of scholarships). This cost is less if sharing a room.

- \$575 Family/Personal Contribution
- \$575 Community/Congregation Contribution
- \$575 Presbytery Contribution
